SCRIPTURE STUDY

BISHOPRIC MESSAGE

My Father used to say to me "somebody who doesn't read is no better off than somebody who can't read." Sometimes we can spend too much time doing things that matter very little. Satan encourages us to spend hours on end watching television or videos, playing video games night in and night out, surfing the Internet, or devoting huge blocks of time to sports, games, or other recreational activities. Activities are good for us but not to the detriment of substituting for our daily dose of "Scripture Study" that each of us needs so desperately in our lives.

Scripture study is a way for God to reveal things to each of us that are personal and helpful. The scriptures are one of the ways God speaks to us — about our needs, our situation, and our life. Since our needs change over a lifetime, God has different thing to tell us at different times.

We can go to the scriptures for doctrine, for instruction or for questions. We can ask "What would God have me do? Or What would He have me feel?" We can find new ideas and thoughts, and receive inspiration and instruction and answers to our questions.

Elder Henry B. Eyring said: "The Book of Mormon is another testament of Jesus Christ, and we learn about Him in its pages. We know that it has great power. It has the power to change lives. It has the power to convert. If you read it with an open heart, you will know that it is the word of God and that it is true".

Here are some practical suggestions from Elder M.Russell Ballard that will help you derive greater power from your study of the scriptures.

- If possible, set a consistent time and place to study when you can be alone and undisturbed.
- Always have a marking pencil ready as you study. Make notations in the margins. Write cross-references. Make the scriptures your by marking them.
- Commit yourself to study for a set amount of time rather than to just read a chapter or a certain number of pages.
- Study topically as well as chronologically. Both approaches have merit, but we need to go to the Topical Guide of the index from time to time and read all that the Lord has said on repentance, faith or some other principle.
- Take time to ponder, reflect, meditate, and pray about what you read. Ask yourselves questions such as "What can I learn from this passage that will help me come unto Christ and be more like Him?"

Let us then go to the Lord in prayer, pleading for help or answers, and those answers will come as we open the scriptures and begin to study them.
