FUD. Fear, Uncertainty, and Doubt. This is a term used a lot in the computer and software industry. FUD is a disinformation strategy used in sales, marketing, public relations, politics, cults, and propaganda. FUD is generally a strategy to influence perception by disseminating negative and dubious or false information and a manifestation of the appeal to fear.

FUD can be used very effectively to create or encourage a movement. It can discredit a legitimate person or business to the point that their reputation is beyond repair. Many people get drawn in and focus on the FUD. In his talk this previous conference, Elder Rasband stated, "Fear has limited the perspective of God's children."

Whether through fake news or real events, so much today can lead us into fear, uncertainty, and doubt. How do we combat this mindset in our own lives?

Moroni emphasized that the Book of Mormon is written for our day by stating, "But behold, Jesus Christ hath shown you unto me, and I know your doing." He spent his last moments in compiling the Book of Mormon writing about spiritual gifts. Moroni closed by saying "that all these gifts of which I have spoken, which are spiritual, never will be done away, even as long as the world shall stand, only according to the unbelief of the children of men. Wherefore, there must be faith; and if there must be faith there must also be hope; and if there must be hope there must also be charity."

Faith, hope, and charity, may be considered the opposite of fear, uncertainty, and doubt. Faith, hope, and charity can also be used very effectively to create or encourage a movement. In the newly published Church History book, Saints, volume 1, there are many excellent examples of faith, hope, and charity.

The book contains numerous faith promoting accounts of early saints that sacrificed all to help build the kingdom of God. This includes trials of faith, and overcoming, or even succumbing to doubts.

There are other accounts where all the saints could hold to was hope for a better day. As you read about families displaced and threatened over and over, and early saints encountering otherwise hopeless situations, yet overcoming, it's impossible to avoid being inspired by their faith and hope.

Finally we get to charity, which Paul says is "the greatest of these." The pure love of Christ demonstrated by so many early saints is inspiring. For instance, Joseph Smith forgiving some that had betrayed him and welcoming them into the fold again with open arms. And then to see the examples of care the saints had for new or emigrating members is wonderful and thought provoking.

Each of these attributes, faith, hope, and charity, are necessary for our salvation. Again from Moroni's closing words, "And except ye have charity ye can in nowise be saved in the kingdom of God; neither can ye be saved in the kingdom of God if ye have not faith; neither can ye if ye have no hope."

Imagine a ward where faith, hope and charity abound. This is a ward where people believe the prophets when they speak, and receive their own witness. A ward where invitations are received with gladness and acted upon with a hope of receiving the promised blessings. A ward where members believe they can be forgiven through the atonement of Jesus Christ and hope to do better. A ward where forgiveness abounds and fault-finding is squelched through the understanding that we are all trying to become like the Savior and none of us are perfect. A ward where charity abounds and is evidenced by ministering brothers and sisters that truly love and care for their families.

Let us allow faith, hope, and charity to create or encourage a movement within each of us as we seek to cast out fear, uncertainty, and doubt by strengthening our faith, looking forward with hope, and showing charity to all those around us.

October Scripture: "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)






PRIMARY PROGRAM Practice & Pizza Party
