

December 2024 - The Four Gifts That Jesus Offers to Us

Christmas is more than just a tradition or a holiday; it is an outpouring of joy that comes from celebrating the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

Jesus Christ's birth is evidence that Heavenly Father loves His children so much that He sent His Son to show us the way to true happiness. It is indeed Wonderful! Celebrating the birth of Jesus reminds us how important the story of the Nativity really is, and it allows a time to reflect on what Jesus Christ provided for each of us.

President Russell M. Nelson spoke of four gifts Jesus Christ offers to each of us that we should each focus on this Christmas season. These four gifts include the unlimited capacity to love. President Nelson stated, "These four unique gifts will bring us more and more joy as we accept them. They were made possible because Jehovah condescended to come to earth as the baby Jesus. He was born of an immortal Father and a mortal mother. He was born in Bethlehem under the most humble of circumstances. His was the holy birth foreseen by prophets since the days of Adam. Jesus Christ is God's transcendent gift — the gift of the Father to all of His children. That birth we joyfully celebrate each Christmas season."

In Alma 7:10-12 we read, "And behold, he shall be born of Mary, at Jerusalem which is the land of our forefathers ... And he shall go forth, suffering pains and afflictions and temptations of every kind; and this that the word might be fulfilled which saith he will take upon him the pains and the sicknesses of his people. And he will take upon him death, that he may loose the bands of death which bind his people."

Jesus Christ's birth was just a beginning step in allowing us to being able to return to Heavenly Father after our mortal lives. President Gordon B. Hinckley taught, "There would be no Christmas if there had not been Easter. The babe Jesus of Bethlehem would be but another baby without the redeeming Christ of Gethsemane and Calvary, and the triumphant fact of the Resurrection. I wish for each of you a time, perhaps only an hour, spent in silent meditation and quiet reflection on the wonder and the majesty of this, the Son of God."

As we take time to quietly reflect as President Hinckley suggests, our gratitude and love for Jesus Christ will increase as we seek to learn more about the sacred event of His birth this Christmas season. The Prince of Peace came to this earth to provide a way for each of us to return to live with a loving Heavenly Father with our families forever.

Spiritual Thought

In a 2002 BYU devotional address titled "Christ the Savior Is Born", President Russell M. Nelson said, "Remember that the fulness of Christ's ministry lies in the future. The prophecies of His Second Coming have yet to be fulfilled. At Christmas, of course, we focus upon His birth. But, He will come again. At His First Coming, Jesus came almost in secret. Only a few mortals knew of His birth. At His Second Coming, the whole of humankind will know of His return. Then He will come, not as "a man traveling on the earth" (Doctrine and Covenants 49:22), but His glory "shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together" (Isaiah 40:5).

In President Nelson's most recent General Conference address, he said "Brothers and sisters, now is the time for you and for me to prepare for the Second Coming of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. Now is the time for us to make our discipleship our highest priority. In a world filled with dizzying distractions, how can we do this? Regular worship in the temple will help us. In the house of the Lord, we focus on Jesus Christ. We learn of Him. We make covenants to follow Him. We come to know Him. As we keep our temple covenants, we gain greater access to the Lord's strengthening power. In the temple, we receive protection from the buffetings of the world. We experience the pure love of Jesus Christ and our Heavenly Father in great abundance! We feel peace and spiritual reassurance, in contrast to the turbulence of the world.

As we enter this Christmas season, our hope and prayer is that each of us will schedule and find the time to worship Him in the temple. As President Nelson promised, "Every sincere seeker of Jesus Christ will find Him in the temple. You will feel His mercy. You will find answers to your most vexing questions. You will better comprehend the joy of His gospel." In the name of Jesus Christ, amen




